NEWS FROM THE DSHA BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Former DSHA Vice President, Jill Lucca, has resigned as chair of the Winter Jig Competition Committee. This event was held most recently at the Pilgrim Congregational Church in January, drawing many Highland dancers from the Upper Midwest and Canada. The DSHA Board of Directors expressed great appreciation for the time and effort Jill put in to make the competition run smoothly. Along with the Summer Highland Dance Competition, it provided an opportunity for dancers to be showcased. The future of the DSHA Winter Jig is dependent on new leadership and a review of alternative activities to fill the future needs of our Highland dancers.

The DSHA Board of Directors approved, at their last meeting, to increase the individual and family fees for the Scottish Highland Dance Lessons. The new semester fees beginning Monday, September 21, 2009, will be Individuals: \$95 for DSHA members and \$110 for non-members; Families: \$120 for DSHA members and \$135 for non-members. Annual membership dues in the Duluth Scottish Heritage Association are \$10 for an individual, \$15 for a family, and \$25 or more for a sponsor, with any amount over \$15 tax deductible. The membership year runs from January through December. A membership form may be found within this newsletter.

The Fall semester will run through January 2010. The second semester begins the first Monday in February and continues through June 2010, following the DSHA Summer Highland Dance Competition. Classes are held at the First Presbyterian Church, 300 East 2nd Street (alley entrance). Beginners meet at 4:30 pm and Advanced dancers meet at 5:30 pm.
